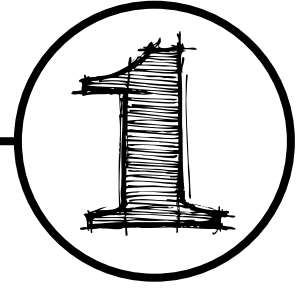

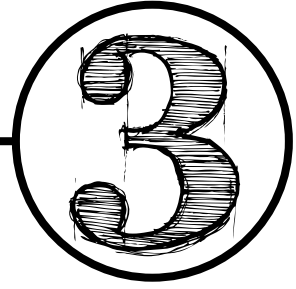


1. In the past, how did people use the Gaiac tree?
